We have just finished up the last Bridge meeting of the year. The

new bridge assumes the watch as of April 19 and will hold its first bridge meeting on 26 April. Unfortunately, with all the precautions that are now in place this meeting will be a video conference call.

I would like to personally thank Marty for the outstanding job he has done as Commander. Since 1956, when Agate Pass Sail & Power Squadron was chartered, Marty is the only member to hold the office of Commander four times. Had we been able to have a Change of Watch you would have been able to see the gift I gave him. We all know that Marty is a computer geek, so I got him a 4G Raspberry PI credit-card sized computer that plugs into a computer monitor or TV and uses a standard keyboard and mouse. Well done Marty!

We no longer store the squadron's belongings in Marty's storage shed. We have completed the move from Reliable Storage to Pro-Guard Storage. Marty and Inez now have more room to store their belongings and the squadron will save about \$200.00 annually. Because we are non-profit, we were able to get a \$89.00 per month storage shed for \$23.00 per month and an insurance plan for \$11.00 per month, total cost per month is \$34.00.

Arabella's Marine Landing in Gig harbor has closed for moorage as of today. All fishing and crabbing is closed until at least April 8th at 5pm - https://wdfw.wa.gov/about/covid-19-updates

Please don't count on reciprocal moorage being available - check with each club as you plan your trip! Anchoring out is still an option - Fuel in Marinas have shortened hours - call before you go! Stay safe and I will try and keep you updated as things progress!


Along with everything else the education department is essentially shut down. The Boat Handling class is on hold until mid May and, depending on what

Flag Size

There is no *one-size-fits-all* policy for nautical flags. Flag size on boats is determined by the size of the boat - either overall vessel length, or the height above the waterline of the tallest mast. This practice is based on longstanding nautical tradition.

A national ensign flown at the flagstaff should be one inch on the fly for each foot of overall length of the vessel. So a 30 foot vessel should fly a national ensign that has at least a 30 inch fly.

All other flags on *power boats* should be 5/8 inch on the fly for each foot of overall length. On *sail-boats*, however, they should be 1/2 inch on the fly for each foot above the waterline of the tallest mast on the boat. (That is, if the top of the mast is 30 feet above the waterline, these other flags should be 15 inches on the fly.)

When purchasing a flag, the size of the flag is usually rounded up to the next larger commercially available size because more often than not the flags worn by a boat are too small.

While a large number of boaters operate a boat that requires a 12 x 18 inch burgee, that burgee would be way too small for a 50' boat. Since proper flag display is one measure of a good seaman, boaters should obtain and fly properly sized flags on their boat.
