Then on the weekend of 8-10 June we will be joining many boats from other squadrons at the Port of Poulsbo for the D16 rendezvous. You do not have to come by boat; you are most welcome to drive in. Details are on the registration form at the end of this issue. If you are coming by boat be sure to get your registration in early to make sure you have a slip. We will be making the arduous journey by boat all the way from Poulsbo Yacht Club to the Port of Poulsbo. We have to take the Great Circle route (across the bay and back) to warm the engines.

At the bridge meeting this past Sunday we finalized the plans for our annual rendezvous in the back bay at Port Ludlow. This is when the incoming commander (me) gets to clean and paint the marker placed on a large rock in 1965 by the squadron.

We will raft-up in the back bay at Port Ludlow for the weekend 15-17 June (the weekend after the D16 rendezvous). The plan is to have a potluck on the boats for Friday and Saturday evening. Breakfast and lunch on Saturday are on your own boats and Sunday morning brunch will be over at the Fireside Restaurant at the resort in Port Ludlow. 
