The Squadron's future depends on its members to participate and lead in order to keep it alive, exciting, and vibrant. As someone who has been active in several different Squadron positions over the years, I can confirm that it is very rewarding to be actively involved. It's a wonderful opportunity to be part of making the Squadron a success and influencing its direction while also having fun really getting to know fellow members.

Take a look at the brief descriptions of the offices below. We have a great group of members currently on the Executive Committee (ExComm) and in the Squadron who have many years of experience to help you!

Please contact me if you are interested in learning more about any of the positions and their prerequisites.

**Commander**: Heads the Squadron and oversees the staff of five department heads (XO, AO, SEO, Secretary, Treasurer), each of whom is responsible for specific aspects of

Squadron activity. Leads the monthly General and ExComm meetings.

**Executive Officer (XO):** Second in command. Deals with the external or public activities of the Squadron, including Boat Show, CoOp Charting, Public Relations, Safety, and Vessel Safety Checks. Supervises the committees that support these activities.

Administrative Officer (AO): Deals with "internal" affairs, such as membership involvement and meetings arrangements. Leads monthly Admin meetings to plan dinners, land cruises, rendezvous, and other fun events. Supervises the committees that support these activities.

**Educational Officer (SEO):** Responsible for working with the ExComm, and Squadron instructors to plan the schedule for educational classes, and to publicize classes, order training materials, communicate with students, etc.

**Secretary**: Takes the minutes of the general and ExComm meetings. Supervises the committees that support webmaster, historian, newsletter editor, and Squadron roster activities.

**Treasurer**: Does the accounting for the Squadron, keeping the records and finances in order. Includes collecting money at dinner meetings, handling tuition for classes, paying bills, preparing tax reports, etc.

**Member at Large**: Takes part in the decision-making processes for guiding the Squadron. Participates in the monthly ExComm meetings.

**Nominating Committee**: Interviews and selects candidates for each elective office and committee.

**Auditing Committee**: Performs annual audit of Squadron financials.

**Rules Committee**: Is the guardian of adherence to USPS bylaws, USPS policy and Squadron bylaws. Handles updating Squadron bylaws, if needed.

#### Other ways to serve:

There are many ways to help out. Even a small commitment can make a big difference. For example:

- Join the Calling Tree to make monthly dinner meeting reminder calls to members.
- Become a Vessel Examiner and help perform Vessel Safety Checks.
- Offer to help out on one of the committees that fall under an elected ExComm member.
- Share your boating experiences with a presentation at a dinner meeting or article in The Halyard.


